The Forum is part of the sustainability process undertaken by the Company, which saw the 2022-2024 Sustainability Plan updated by the BoD on 24 February 2022 and the second Integrated Report published thereafter.

As a result, once the Stakeholder Engagement Management Policy was approved, with which INWIT adopted a tool that would allow for more transparent and improved management of relations with all parties, the company continued along the same lines with this event to provide insights into ESG topics, which are increasingly more central and integrated into its business strategy.
